Role and Scope of Darwell School Council and Betterment Association

# Role

- 1. Advisory Body: Serve as an advisory group to the school administration and the school board, providing input on issues impacting student learning and school environment.
- 2. Community Engagement: Facilitate communication and collaboration between parents, teachers, students, and the wider community.
- 3. Educational Support: Advocate for and support initiatives that enhance the quality of education and student experiences at Darwell School.
- 4. Resource Allocation: Assist in identifying and managing resources for school improvement projects and student activities, in alignment with the Betterment Association's objectives.

### Scope

- 1. Consultation and Advice: Provide consultation and advice on matters concerning curriculum, school policies, and student welfare.
- 2. Event Organization: Organize and support school events, activities, and volunteer opportunities to enhance school spirit and community involvement.
- 3. Fundraising: Oversee and conduct fundraising activities under the Betterment Association to support school initiatives and projects.

4. Meeting Management: Conduct regular meetings to discuss and address issues related to school improvement, student activities, and community engagement.

#### Limitations

- 1. Non-Governance Role: The Council does not participate in the governance of the school, such as hiring decisions, individual staff evaluations, or internal management.
- 2. Advisory, Not Authoritative: While the Council provides advice and suggestions, final decision-making authority rests with the school administration and the school board.
- 3. Non-Political Stance: The Council maintains a non-political stance and focuses solely on educational and community betterment issues.
- 4. Complaint Management: While open to hearing feedback, the Council is not a platform for airing grievances or personal disputes. It directs such issues to appropriate school or district channels.

### **Engagement Guidelines**

- 1. Inclusive Participation: Encourage and welcome diverse viewpoints and participation from all members of the school community. Hate speech is not tolerated.
- 2. Respectful Communication: Promote respectful and constructive dialogue in all interactions and meetings.
- 3. Transparency: Operate with transparency in decision-making processes and communication with the school community.
- 4. Focused Agenda: Ensure that meeting agendas and Council activities align with the defined role and scope, prioritizing matters that impact student learning and well-being.
